#### The Story of ORCA's Founding

On the evening of September 21, 2011, a PFLAG Albuquerque meeting took place at the First Congregational United Church of Christ.

After that meeting, a woman observed that PFLAG should have a meeting for seniors. That was the beginning of the process that led to PFLAG Albuquerque hosting the first meeting for seniors on February 10, 2012, from 2 PM to 4:30 PM at Albuquerque's Palo Duro Senior Center. The meeting took place in a triangular shaped room and 20 people attended. One of the interesting aspects of the meeting was that a woman who happened to be at the senior center that day saw our sign and decided to attend the meeting.

After the success of the first meeting, PFLAG continued to have monthly senior meetings. They were held at different senior centers and multigenerational centers in Albuquerque, to see what location worked best. Soon, meetings had been held in all of Albuquerque's eight senior/multigenerational center locations.

PFLAG Albuquerque felt that SAGE USA might be the right "platform to support future meetings and activities. They applied to be designated the SAGE affiliate for the state of New Mexico, but were told they would have to limit their "service area" to a smaller region. Thus, the organization became known as SAGE Albuquerque. We became an affiliate of SAGE USA in 2013.

As the years went by, we decided to host meetings at North Valley Senior Center and Highland Senior Center. Over time, as we held more and more meetings at Highland Senior Center, it became our "organizational home."

In 2022, SAGE USA required all affiliates to stop using the name SAGE. Because this name was central to our identity, this caused a bit of an uproar. In September of 2022, we held a community meeting at which we settled upon a new name – Older Rainbow Community of Albuquerque (ORCA).

Now here it is 2025, and ORCA is a teenager..., and celebrating 13 years of providing wonderful ways for people to get together...

#### IT COULDN'T BE EASIER

There has been talk about elderly people living alone. Who's looking out for them? What happens if they need immediate help? Are they even still alive? Maybe you are one of these people.

Well, the solution is as easy as one, two three. Here it is:

- 1. Do you have a cel phone that you can use to text messages?
- 2. If so, do you know how to text? If not, don't give us that old excuse: I'm too old. You are never too old to text, particularly if it's a question of your health and safety. If you don't know how to use your phone's text feature, email <a href="mailto:SC@ORCAABQ.org">SC@ORCAABQ.org</a> and leave a message. We can help you learn how to text with your cel phone. If there's enough people who need this help, we can organize a workshop for everyone who needs to learn how to text. It's easy. And it

might save your life.

**3.** Do you have a friend you can text? Do they have a cel phone they can use to text? Do they know how to use this feature? If so, will they text you on a regular basis? Will you text them on a regular basis? Ask that friend if they will text you each day at about the same time, checking if you are okay. You can simply text back, "Yes" or "I'm okay." Or, you can text them about the same time each day, checking if they are okay. Just by texting, you both indicate you are still breathing. Mission accomplished, and it takes 2 minutes at most.


If you or they don't get the return text saying you or they are okay within a set amount of time--say an hour—you can re-text, call, come to your or their residence or call Fire and Rescue to kick down your door. This last option is the choice of last resort. Therefore, it's important to text each other back as soon as possible or else...


This is a simple way to let each other know that everything is okay, and it doesn't take a village to make it happen. All it takes is two people--you and a friend--and two cel phones.

But don't wait.

Start today.

It could be a matter of life or death.

If you wish, join us beforehand at **6pm** at **El Patio de Albuquerque on Harvard Street** across from the campus for some delicious New Mexico cuisine.






The rest of us will be "non-Randy." All of us will be dressed in rainbow shirts, cat's eye classes, and colorful fedoras.

# **Cris Williamson Concert**

Decades before indie labels were the norm, and years before women had any real access to the industry, Cris Williamson was busy changing the face of popular music. In 1975, the twenty-something former schoolteacher recorded *The Changer and the Changed*, for her brainchild, Olivia Records. the first woman-owned woman-focused record company.

Her music and voice quickly became the soundtrack of a movement and was the cornerstone of what would become known as "women's music," music created, performed, and marketed specifically to women.

Today, that recording, *The Changer and the Changed*, remains one of the best-selling independent releases of all time. Says Bonnie Raitt, "The first time I heard Cris' music, it was like hearing honey dripped on a cello... Cris has been a whole lot of women's heroes—including mine."


