



Spend Time with Others

(If you missed this last month, you can read it now. Then plan to attend one of the events below.)

Socializing with friends, family, and even casual acquaintances—such as people you may meet at a book club or place of worship—is one of the most effective (and enjoyable) ways to keep your memory sharp. It can also reduce the likelihood of serious cognitive issues down the lines.

Research, such as a 2024 study published in the Journal Innovation in Aging, confirms this. That study found that social interactions significantly improved executive function (which helps you make plans and decisions and solve problems) in older adults. And a report published in the journal Nature Aging in 2023 found that people who are very socially active in midlife and beyond have a 30 to 50 percent lower risk of developing dementia.

You don't need to attend parties several nights a week to get those memory preserving benefits. Simple activities, such as talking, taking a walk, or playing board or card games with friends, will do it.



ORCA community members provide compassionate and confidential peer-to-peer support to participants who experience loss and grief.

Our loss group focuses on the developmental stages we go through when coping with losses. We discuss how individuals manage each stage and throughout their lives. The next meeting is on June 4th at 5:30pm at the Highland Senior Center, 131 Monroe NE. Membership in the Highland Senior Center is required to attend events at that facility, and the annual membership cost is \$20. You can join at the front desk before the meeting.

This nonjudgmental welcoming space is for all ORCA community members who've experienced loss. Come to listen, learn, and share your stories with others. We offer a safe and confidential environment to find perspective, comfort, and healing.

The group is open to all people who are grieving. **Please RSVP if you plan to attend**

Peers in our group are welcome to distribute supportive handouts for each session and will need to know how many to prepare.

So, won't you please join us.




