National Survey on

Medicare, Medicaid & Trans Health

A team of trans, queer, and cis allies at Brown University, Fenway Health, Yale, and the VA is currently recruiting trans people with Medicare and/or Medicaid to share their experiences by completing a survey about their everyday lives, including their health and healthcare.

Findings from this needs assessment study will be used to educate policymakers, healthcare workers, and the broader community about the health needs and concerns of the trans community and advocate for legal protections and better access to care with the goal of improving the health and well-being of trans people in the U.S.

Eligible participants can enter into a raffle for the chance to win one of 54 prizes (45 - \$10 prizes; 6 - \$25 prizes; 1 - \$50 prize; 1 - \$100 prize; and 1 - \$250 prize).

Some participants will be invited to participate in a paid follow-up interview.

YOUR VOICE MATTERS: A team of trans and cisgender researchers at Brown University wants to hear from trans people about their experiences navigating Medicare and Medicaid and the healthcare system. We are committed to using findings to advocate for better healthcare for trans communities.

The needs assessment survey takes about 35 minutes. If you are eligible, you can complete the survey online or call the team, and they can ask you the questions. **If you are eligible and take the survey, you will have the choice of being entered into a raffle and the chance to win one of 54 gift cards ranging in value from \$10 to \$250.** Some people will also be asked to do a paid follow-up interview if they are interested.

You may be eligible to participate in this survey if you are:

- Transgender, genderqueer, non-binary, gender non-conforming, and/or have a gender identity that is different from your assigned sex at birth
- Are 18 years of age or older
- Have lived in the United States for 3 months in the past year
- Had Medicare or Medicaid in the past year

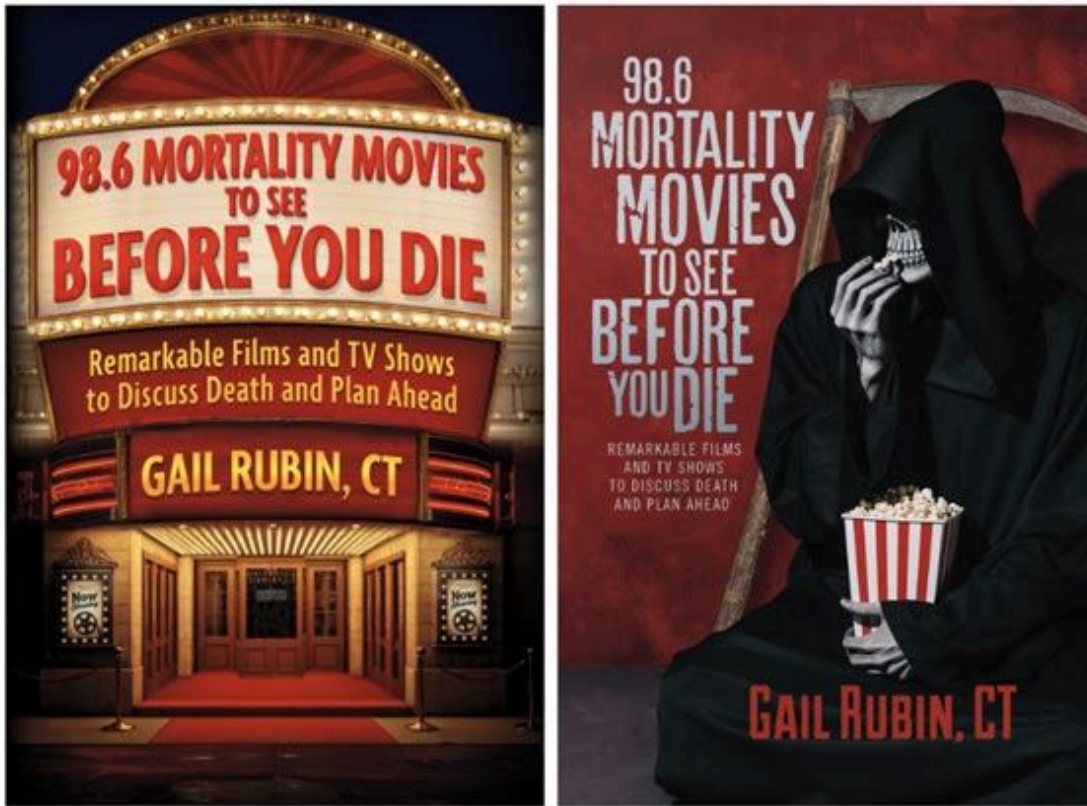

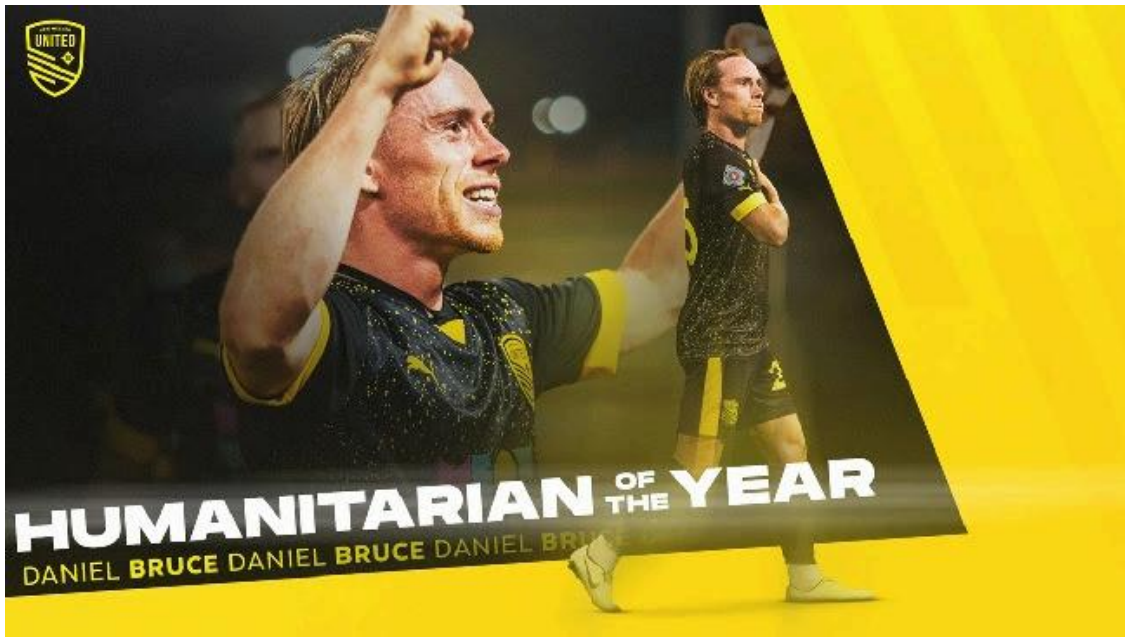

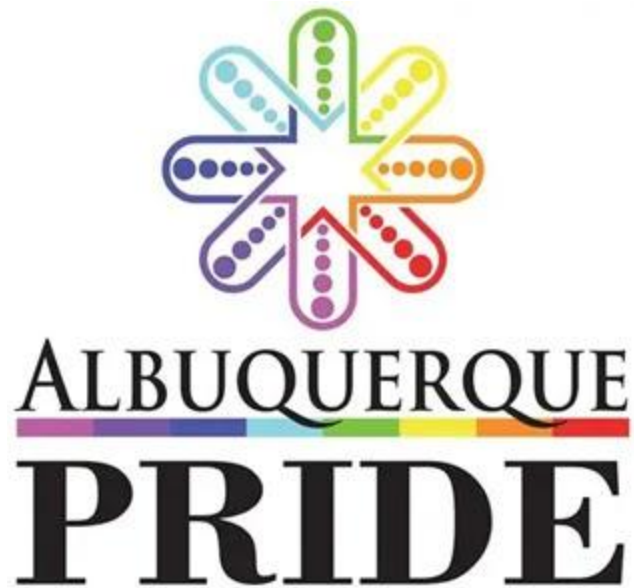

Every person deserves affirming care that is both accessible and rooted in the understanding that our dignity is directly tied to respect for our identity, our wishes for care, and our care circle (chosen family). This is true when experiencing a medical emergency and especially while navigating end-of-life.

Join us for this two-part series (May 16 & May 30) to discuss and prep for times when you can't speak for yourself. You'll finish the 2nd session with notarized legal paperwork.

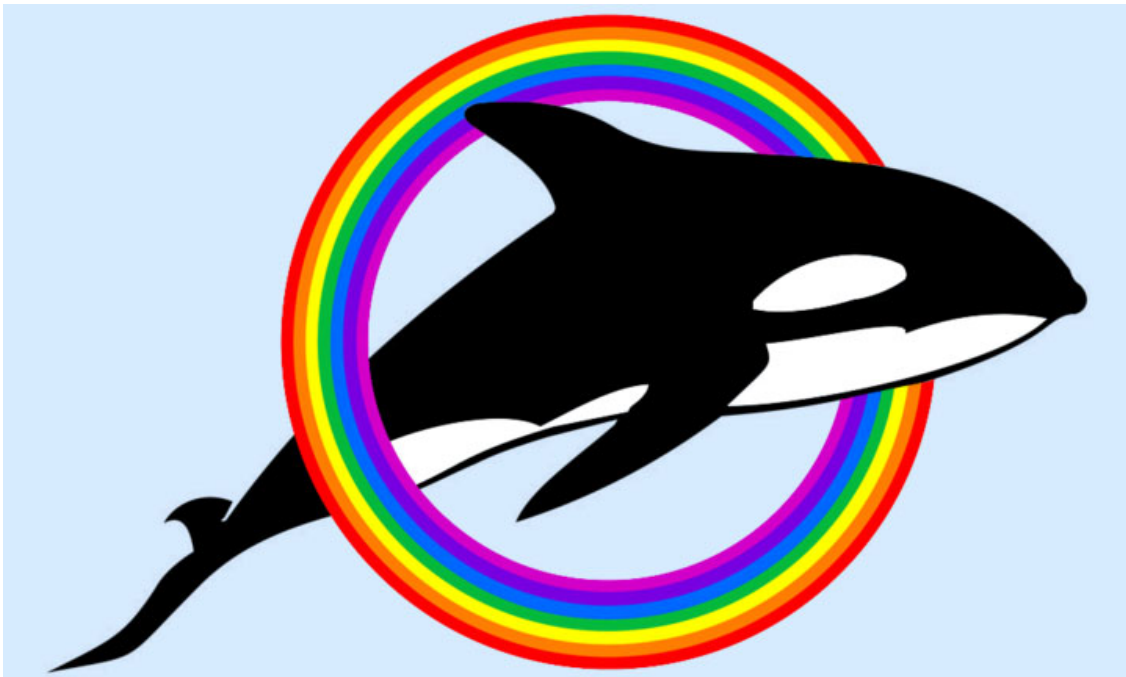
